Intervention Programmes during the school day	£9240	A n employed class teacher will cover the class while the class teacher works with three to four groups of pupils on an area identified on the IPP. These sessions will take place in the afternoons and will be in addition to the daily English and mathematics lessons. These sessions will range from 5 week bocks to 10 week blocks and will be reviewed at the end of the sessions and impact discussed with SLT and parents/carers. Curriculum Cultural Capital Enrichment	£1950	Following the return to school it was clear that cultural capital enrichment was needed and curriculum hands on experiences were needed to reinforce key concepts and knowledge.
