At the end of term, we will have a lucky dip from the coloured stars in our last book assembly. **Any names pulled out will win a new book of their own choice!**

Please support us with this challenge – the more your children are exposed to high-quality stories, the better their vocabulary understanding, reading comprehension and own written stories will be.
