Dear Parents/Carers,

Swimming Lessons Summer 2026 (Years R, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6)

Swimming lessons with 'Get in the Swim' for the summer term will be from Monday 20th April to Friday 17th July 2026 (excluding the half term holiday). Each year group will be allocated a day and time to swim each week – please see table below:

Day	Year Group
Monday	Year 2, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6
Thursday	Reception
Friday	Year 1

The total cost for swimming lessons in the summer term will be **£61.20**, this includes the 'Get in the Swim' cost of £4.50 per lesson, staffing costs and an administration fee. This is to be paid by **Wednesday 15th April 2026** through our online payment system Arbor Pay.

If you have not paid by this date your child(ren) will not be permitted to take part in the lessons.

Please ensure that on your child's allocated day they bring in swimming costume/trunks, swimming hat and a towel. The girls swimming costume should be a one piece costume and the boys trunks must be above the knee and preferably similar to cycle shorts. Children are welcome to wear goggles which are of a good fit – the lenses part must NOT sit on the soft part of the eyes and should stick on the face without the strap on the head, this will show that these are suitable for your child. Poorly fitting goggles can lead to permanent eye damage.

As part of these lessons, we want to ensure that all participants receive the best possible instruction to enhance their swimming skills. To facilitate this, we would like to explain some important aspects of the sessions.

By allowing your child to take part in these lessons, you are giving your consent for Get in the Swim qualified swimming instructors to provide gentle and appropriate contact when necessary. This may include guiding students to help them improve their techniques and confidence in the water.

Get in the Swim instructors are trained in first aid and will assist in any medical situations that may arise during the lesson.

We recognise that some children may have additional needs or medical conditions that require special consideration. By sharing appropriate information and allowing staff to inform the swim school of any requirements, we can ensure a safe and supportive environment for all participants.

If your child is swimming for the first time, please pop into the office to collect a consent form. For children who have swum before please inform the office if there are any changes to your child's medical record.

Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our records accurate and ensuring all pupils can take part safely.

If you have any questions, please ask your child's class teacher or the office staff.
